- MAFC website updated (ongoing).
- Dr. Perry participated as needed in monthly MAASTO Planning Committee and MAASTO Motor Carrier teleconferences to support upcoming projects and track other freight-related work within the agencies.
- Work continues on web delivery, data management and performance reporting for, *Truck Parking Information Management System Performance Metrics and Data Warehousing* project. States have approved the TPIMS web design and access rules. All initial requirements of the project have been met and MAFC continues management of the data warehouse and web application in partnership with TOPS.

- MAFC continues to participate with the MAASTO CAV team and will work to provide MAFC member perspectives regarding strategic planning, operations, and policy.
- For the 2022-23 agenda, the MAASTO electrification project has been scoped and submitted for contracting. The resiliency project is under development and will be further developed at the MAFC annual meeting.
- Preparations are finalizing for the 2022 MAFC Annual meeting. The MAFC portion of the event includes 3 sessions, a tour, and peer to peer dinner and networking.
