WORK COMPLETED:

TAC Meetings

- Coordinated a face-to-face meeting of the Clear Roads Technical Advisory Committee on September 9-13 in Vancouver, Washington, held in conjunction with the 2013 Winter Maintenance Peer Exchange. This included communication with TAC members; coordinating with members of AASHTO, Aurora and PNS; meeting logistics; and agenda development.
- ➤ Began planning for a face-to-face meeting of the Clear Roads Technical Advisory Committee on March 25-27, 2014 in Portland, Maine. Planning includes all preparations for the meeting such as communication with TAC members, meeting logistics, agenda and meeting materials.
- > Drafted meeting minutes and followed up on action items from the Fall 2013 meeting.

Administration and Marketing

- > Updated the Clear Roads website with current TAC members, project status and meeting information.
- Maintained and updated commitment, obligation, and overall budget information for the pooled fund in coordination with MnDOT.
- > Supported efforts of TAC members in recruiting new members and talking about Clear Roads at conferences.

- Drafted a two-page brief for the completed research project on deicer toxicity

Research Support

New projects

 - Understanding the Chemical and Mechanical Performance of Snow and Ice Control Agents on Porous or Permeable Pavements
 - Comparison of Materials Distribution Systems
 - o Environmental Factors Causing Fatigue in Snowplow Operators
 - Determining the Toxicity of Deicing Materials
 - o Development of a Totally Automated Spreading System
 - o Understanding the True Costs of Snow and Ice Control Operations
- > Plug and Play Initiative: Coordinated with the project subcommittees and other stakeholders.
- Winter Maintenance Knowledge Base: Gathered Clear Roads discussion threads to have posted as a resource for others.

Implementation

- Developed a survey to assess the level of implementation within Clear Roads member states of the Clear Roads completed research.
- > Coordinated with the Technology Transfer Committee to develop new recommendations for technology transfer tools both to share project results with non-members and to aid members in implementation.

STATUS AND COMPLETION DATE:

As expected, the funds expended are a little ahead of schedule due to the fall meeting and peer exchange, RFP development activities, and multiple article submissions, all of which are temporary activities. CTC will expend fewer hours in the next quarter as our focus turns primarily to research project support. The contract is scheduled to end August 31, 2015.
