## **Project Description:**

The North/West Passage Transportation Pooled Fund (TPF) Study is a multi-state cooperative program for the coordination, development, and deployment of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) along the I-90 and I-94 corridor. The states of Washington, Idaho, Wyoming, Montana, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, and Wisconsin began meeting in February 2002 to discuss the development of a North/West Passage multi-state transportation program. The states formally established as a TPF Study through the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) in 2003. FHWA serves as a monitoring body, providing strategic and technical input. Minnesota serves as the Program Administrator and a Steering Committee consists of one representative from each of the states that have financially contributed to the effort. The Steering Committee meets monthly or as necessary to provide overall program direction.

North/West Passage members contribute \$25,000 or more annually to the pooled fund and are reimbursed for program travel. A work plan is developed and approved annually by the Steering Committee. Work Plan 1 and Work Plan 2 were funded through TFP-5(093). That project number was closed out and Work Plan 3 - Work Plan 12 are funded through the FHWA number TPF-5(190). # Progress this Quarter (includes meetings, work plan status, contract status, significant progress, etc.):

### Work Plan Projects

- Project 10.6: Multistate Assessment of Interstate Speed Limit Impacts
   Project Objective: To examine the North/West Passage states' current practices for setting speed limits along I-90/I-94, document legislative influences within the past 10 years, and assess the impacts (e.g. safety, enforcement) of higher speeds and varying speed limits along the multistate corridor.
  - Continued to finalize the summary report.
- Project 12.1: Operations Task Force Year 5
   Project Objective: North/West Passage has supported an Operations Task Force for four years with the intent of establishing relationships, enhancing the scope of operations-oriented projects, supporting further implementation of project findings, and increasing interaction among the states outside of major events.
  - On October 18, 2017 the Task Force held a seasonal coordination webinar. The purpose of the webinar was to remind operations staff in the North/West Passage states of the tools available to support traveler information and operational coordination during major events along I-90/I-94.
  - On November 15, 2017 the Task Force discussed the NWP Corridor Large Scale ITS Deployment Development project.
  - On December 13, 2017 the Task Force discussed road condition reporting practices.
- Project 12.3: NWP Corridor Large Scale ITS Deployment Development
   Project Objective: The intent of this project is to follow a process to determine the most appropriate large scale
   ITS deployment by prioritizing both the technologies to be deployed and the location. The overall concept would
   be to follow a process to prioritize both the technologies to be deployed, the location, and finally the funding
   proposal.
  - Project Kickoff held during the October 17, 2017 Steering Committee Meeting. There are a number of federal funding opportunities that were shared for consideration if a large scale deployment project should be proposed by North/West Passage. Initial project ideas were also discussed.

- On November 15 during the Operations Task Force meeting, this project was presented for discussion
  and to gather additional project ideas. A draft project idea for the Dynamic Virtual DMS Corridor will
  be developed. The project definition will note which grant applications the idea should be submitted
  to, the timeline, and match requirements as well as overall magnitude.
- During the December Steering Committee meeting the concept for a "Dynamic Virtual DMS Corridor" was shared.
- Project 12.4: Evaluation of Rural 511 Phone Service

Project Objective: This project will identify the state of practice and trends in usage to determine the potential future of 511 phone service. With the increased use of mobile web devices, applications, and in-vehicle navigation, many states are exploring the elimination, modification, or rebranding of 511 phone services.

- Project Kickoff held during the November 21, 2017 Steering Committee meeting. Interviews were held with ID, MT, MN, and ND. Key highlights from the interviews were shared.
- In December, interviews were held with WA and WY. Started compiling interview information.
- In January, an interview conducted with North Carolina DOT. Continue compiling interview information.
