Project Description:

This program of research focuses on optimizing pavement surface texture characteristics. Phase I and II of the program have demonstrated the benefits of a collaborative research program and addressed some of the emerging challenges in the evaluation of pavement surface properties and the changes needed to best support the next generation of pavement and asset management systems. The focus of Phase III is to continue to support the implementation of asset management approaches and tools that help improve the safety of our road networks by reducing the number of crashes and related fatalities. It represents a concerted effort to bring pavement design and evaluation experts together with maintenance and safety professionals to maximize the contribution of the pavement community Towards Zero Deaths on US highways.
