#### **Project Description:**

This project will seek to understand how implements of husbandry impact the nation's bridges. Further, tools for completing bridge rating with these vehicles in mind will be developed. Additionally, a generic posting vehicle will attempt to be developed. This generic posting vehicle will allow rating engineers to post bridges in such a way that the various types of vehicles will be covered.

Progress this Quarter (includes meetings, work plan status, contract status, significant progress, etc.):

Significant progress has been made on the modeling of the bridges tested during the previous two summers. These calibrated models will be used to simulate the response of the tested bridges to over 100 different implements of husbandry combinations.
